

# SINGAPORE WORKPLACE SAFETY & HEALTH REPORT


Improvement in rate of workplace fatalities in 1H 2023, while rate of workplace major injuries remained stable.




### Dangerous Occurrences (DO)

Positive outcomes from the Heightened Safety Period (HSP) observed but SAFE\* Measures will continue to be rolled out post-HSP.



- 2 Manufacturing and Construction contributed 54% of the fatal and major injuries in 1H2023.
  - Injuries in Construction driven by smaller scale works such as Addition & Alteration works, Renovation and Facility Management.
  - > Injuries in Manufacturing driven by Metalworking industry.

Manufacturing & Construction were leading sectors.

Slips, Trips & Falls remained the top cause of major injuries in 1H 2023.
