EA Alert: New Demerit Points Framework Effective 1 November 2014

This advisory is applicable to all employment agencies (EAs) regardless of licence type.

Dear Key Appointment Holders and EA Personnel,

The changes to the Demerit Points System (DPS) will take effect from 1 November 2014, as communicated during the EA seminar held on 9 and 10 June 2014.

Changes to Demerit Points System

2 The changes to the DPS are as follows:

This is introduced to manage higher-risk EAs that accumulate more DPs		 EAs that accumulate 18 DPs will have a partial forfeiture of \$15K SD and are required to top up their SD back to \$60K.
[Key Change #3] All KAHs to pass Certificate of Employment Intermediaries (KAH) test at 12 DPs	No such requirement	 Once EAs accumulate 12 DPs, all KAHs are required to sit for the CEI(KAH) exam again.

This is to ensure that all the KAHs are sufficiently familiar with the regulations so that they can operate the EA lawfully


 The EAs' Work Pass and Employment Pass Online (WPOL/EPOL) accounts will be suspended until all KAHs have passed the exam.

[Key Change #4]

Extended runway, with licence suspension or revocation at 24 DPs

- EAs with a high number of DPs may not be suitable to remain in the industry.
- MOM has powers to revoke licences, and has done so when serious offences have been committed.
 Where the accumulation of DPs arise from largely technical offences,
 MOM had exercised leniency in the past and may not have revoked licences.
- EAs that accumulate 24 DPs would have their licence suspended or revoked based on circumstances which will be assessed on a case-bycase basis.


3 An overview of the revised DPS is as follows:




Validity of Demerit Points

There is no change to how the validity of the DPs is computed today. All DPs will remain live for a fixed period of 12 months from the date of issuance of each DP, provided an EA has less than 12 DPs.

As long as an EA has less than 12 DPs, all DPs will remain live for only a fixed period of 12 months from the date of issuance of each DP.



Once an EA accumulates 12 DPs or more, the EA will be placed on surveillance for a year. All the DPs will only expire 12 months from the date of issuance of the latest DPs.



Effective Date of Implementation

The actions specified in the revised DPS will apply to EAs when they accumulate new demerit points after 1 November 2014.
