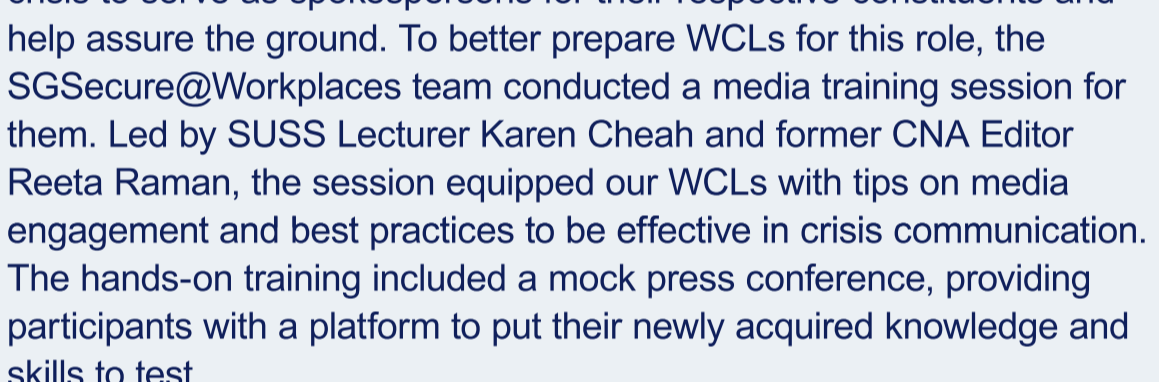

[Jointly organised by MHA and Temasek Foundation, and conducted by the Red Cross, 5 Oct 2023]

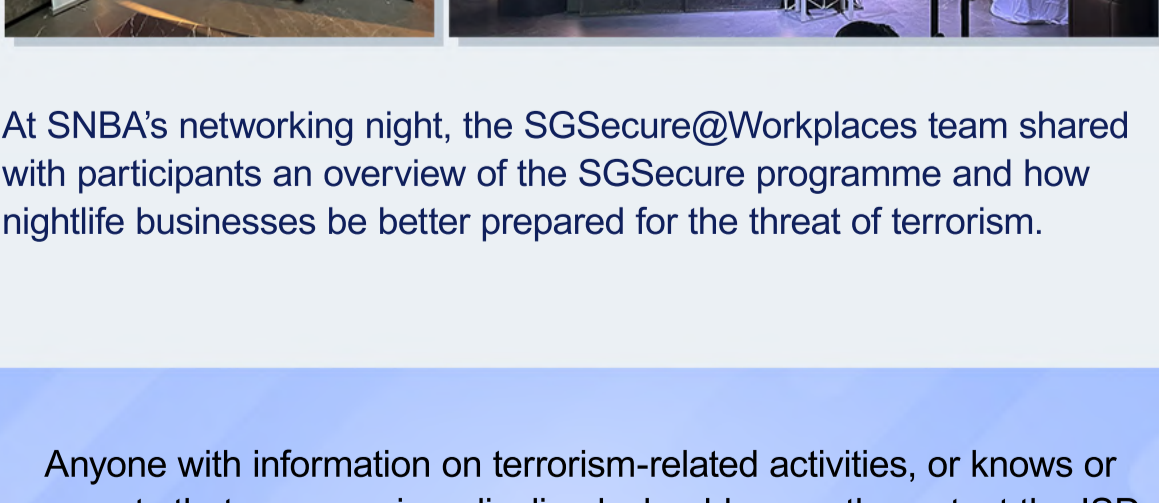


Singapore Nightlife Business Association (SNBA) [SNBA, 26 Oct 2023]
