- Lock window grilles before cleaning the window exterior.
- Use window cleaning tools with extended handles.



Cleaning window interior

- Lock the window before cleaning interior.
- Use window cleaning tools with extended handles.

Be a Responsible
FDW Employer

Most Singaporeans today live in high-rise buildings. This increases the risk of injury or death caused by falling from height.

For your foreign domestic worker (FDW) who has to hang laundry or clean windows in your high-rise home regularly, this risk is even higher. As an FDW employer, it is your responsibility to ensure she does her work safely.

Make sure your FDW follows these safety precautions.

Hanging Laundry - Do's



Make sure feet are firmly on the floor, and the body is inside the apartment.



Hang the heavier clothes closer to the bracket and the lighter clothes at the far end of pole.

Poles are not overloaded with clothes.



Cleaning Windows - Don'ts



Do not stand on chairs, stools or any raised platform.



Do not climb or lean out of window to clean window exterior.



Do not retrieve objects that have fallen out onto the window ledge or platform.

Hanging Laundry - Don'ts



Do not stand on chairs, stools or any raised platform.

Do not lean too far out of the window.

Do not lean too far out of the window to retrieve clothing from far end of the pole.

Do not overload clothes poles with too many clothes.
