<u>Sharing of Stay-Home Notice (SHN) and related COVID-19 tests costs between employers of transfer non-domestic work permit holders</u>

Dear Key Appointment Holders and EA Personnel,

From 12 November 2021, the measure to allow employers to share the cost of SHN and related COVID-19 tests, will be extended to employers of non-domestic work permit holders (WPHs) seeking transfers.

When an employer hires a non-domestic WPH seeking a transfer through an employment agency (EA), the EA will be required to:

- i) inform employers who meet the <u>criteria</u> of the cost sharing measure,
- ii) explain MOM's criteria and guidelines, and
- iii) recommend that employers refer to MOM's guideline on the cost sharing approach. EAs should also ensure that employers sign a written agreement on the cost-sharing arrangement.

This requirement will take effect via the amended Employment Agencies Licence Conditions under "Facilitate the sharing of Stay-Home Notice (SHN) and related COVID-19 tests costs between employers of work permit holders" (see <u>Annex A</u>).

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ON SHARING OF SHN AND RELATED COVID-19 TESTS COSTS BETWEEN EMPLOYERS OF MIGRANT WORKERS ON WORK PERMITS

1. Can employers who had transferred their Work Permit Holder (WPH) before this announcement now ask the new employer to share the SHN and related COVID-19 tests costs?

Any arrangement for the sharing of SHN and related COVID-19 tests costs should be discussed and agreed upon before the employer gives consent for the WPH to transfer.

- 2. Can employers also share other hiring costs such as the EA service fee? Employers are only permitted to share SHN and related COVID-19 tests costs of WPHs entering Singapore and not any other costs relating to the hiring of WPH e.g. EA fees, medical insurance, etc.
- 3. Can employers determine their own way of sharing the SHN and related COVID-19 tests costs instead of using MOM's recommendation to pro-rate evenly across 12 months?

Employers can determine their own ways of sharing the SHN and related COVID-19 tests costs so long as they meet the criteria set out in MOM's guideline.

4. Can employment agencies (EAs) charge fees for facilitating the sharing of SHN and related COVID-19 tests costs?

EAs should not charge a fee for facilitating such cost sharing as MOM has already provided the sharing guidelines and employer agreement template.
