

Tips to prevent your MDW from resorting to unlicensed moneylenders





Dear Employers,

Are you aware of your Migrant Domestic Worker's (MDW) financial wellbeing? Does she save for rainy days? Is she in urgent need of money?

Regardless of the financial situation she's in, it's useful to have a talk with her early to understand if she has enough savings to avoid borrowing money, so that you can avoid unwanted scenarios.



What to do if your MDW asks you for a loan? Be open and hear her. Take the time to understand her situation and explore alternative solutions where both of you are comfortable with.

If you decide to give her salary in advance to tide her over, it is advisable to put the amount in writing to minimise any disputes.

What to do if your MDW borrowed from an unlicensed moneylender?

If your MDW had borrowed from an unlicensed moneylender, report the matter to the Police and MOM immediately. Do not accede to the demands of the unlicensed moneylender in any way.







How can you help your MDW who has fallen victim to a loan scam?

Advise your MDW to cease contact with the scammer. File a police report at the nearest Neighborhood Police Centre.

Show your support by telling your MDW to call MOM's helpline for MDWs at 1800-339-5505 if she requires someone to talk to in her native language.

Educate your MDW about basic financial concepts such as budgeting, saving, and spending within her means.




Motivate your MDW to set specific financial goals. Encourage her to start small and grow her savings.


