Here are some ways to foster stronger partnerships across your community.

ENHANCING YOUR SUPPORT NETWORKS



Many organisations connect with the rest of their industry through their respective associations and councils. If you are a building manager or owner, you can also connect with the Police and other premise owners by joining the Safety and Security Watch Group (SSWG). As a SSWG member, you will collaborate with the Police and SCDF to devise measures to enhance the safety & security of your premise and formulate response plans to deal with contingencies.

Additionally, the Industry Safety and Security Watch Group (iSSWG) was introduced to address safety and security concerns at the industry-level. The formation of iSSWG allows the Police to work closely with industry members, such as retailers and hotels, on safety and security issues on a more holistic level by codeveloping guidelines and sharing best practices.
