
ARMED ATTACKER INCIDENTS



In the event of an armed attack, stay calm, run away from danger, hide if you are unable to escape and inform the Police when it is safe to do so. Building owners should also ensure access to Fire Command Centre is secured and track movement of attackers via CCTV if possible. Also be sure to have useful information ready such as your building or office layout, profile of occupants, key cards and designated point-of-contacts who can link up quickly with the authorities. It is important to evaluate the situation calmly and assess the immediate surroundings for possible escape routes.



FINDING SUSPICIOUS ITEMS



Does the item have

wires, circuit boards

sticking out or emits a

ticking sound?

Is the item typical of

what you would

expect to find in the location?

Does the item look

deliberately hidden?

Once the item has been deemed suspicious, do not touch it and keep people away from it. Alert the building security immediately and call the Police. Be sure not to use communication devices within 15m of the item as these may inadvertently set off the Improvised Explosive Device (IED).

EXPLOSIVES OR CHEMICAL AGENT RELEASE



chemical agent has been released, you may notice persons in proximity collapsing or appearing incapacitated without a reason. Please evacuate as quickly as possible and call the authorities immediately. You may learn more on CBRE terrorism in workplaces here.
