

Removal of Rostered Routine Testing (RRT)


You will not need to go for RRT if you meet any of the criteria below:

1. You are fully vaccinated and stay in a dormitory*.
2. You are currently working in the Construction, Marine Shipyard and Process sectors.
3. You are a frontline worker working in dormitories, onboarding centres and recreation centres.

*excluding migrant workers living in Brani and Pasir Panjang dormitories

New Primary Healthcare Plan (PCP)

If you are a work permit or S Pass holder who live in dormitories **OR** work in the Construction, Marine Shipyard and Process sector, your employer must purchase a PCP for you **by 31 March 2023** even if your work pass is not due for renewal between 1 April 2022 to 31 March 2023.



For newly arrived workers or existing workers renewing their work passes from 1 April onwards, your employer will need to buy the PCP before the new work passes can be issued. For more information on the PCP benefits, click [here](#) to view the PCP bulletin.


Government agencies such as the Police or the Ministry of Manpower **WILL NOT** ask you for money or your passwords
