# Key announcements



## Updated Safe Management Measures (From 26 April 2022)

- No group size limit and no safe distancing
- Mask wearing will continue to be needed for all indoor settings, but will be optional in outdoor settings
- Lifting of Vaccinated-Differentiated Safe Management Measures except for high-risk (e.g. more than 500 participants at any one time) and food and beverage settings

## Community and RC visits for fully vaccinated and unvaccinated/partially vaccinated workers

- All workers may apply for an Exit Pass to visit the community
- All workers may visit the RC with no Exit Pass

# Primary Care Plan Talks @ Recreation Centres

**From 1 April 2022,**

Employers must purchase a Primary Care Plan (PCP) for Work Permit or S Pass holders working in the Construction, Marine Shipyard or Process (CMP) sectors, or staying in dormitories.

The PCP will cover most of your primary healthcare needs.

## Some of you have asked...

**“Why do I have to co-pay for outpatient visits now?”**

A: Personal responsibility remains a key principle in Singapore’s healthcare approach and co-payment is one such feature to enable this. While your employer is primarily responsible for paying of your PCP, there is a small co-payment sum for each visit at the medical centre or telemedicine consultation to ensure personal responsibility.

**“What can I do if I am unable to pay for medical bills due to late payment of salaries?”**

A: You should still proceed to seek treatment at medical centres and raise salary issues to ACE officers as soon as possible.

**“Are dental treatments covered under PCP?”**

A: No. However, your employer is responsible for your dental treatment bills as long as it is deemed necessary by a Singapore-registered medical or dental professional.



# Protect yourself against Dengue!



Remove all stagnant water by turning over containers, pots and pails



Clear away unwanted items such as unused containers, old helmets and spoilt boots



Remove excess water from canvas sheets and store properly when not in use



Spray insecticide in dark corners of your room



Apply mosquito repellent and wear covered clothes where possible
