A Ministry of Manpower (MOM) publication for Migrant Domestic Workers (MDWs) in Singapore

Perform domestic work for your official employer only



The name of your official employer is stated in your work permit card. It is an offence if you work for someone else; or perform non-domestic work for your official employer. You will be fined or jailed for working illegally. You will also be sent back home and cannot enter or work in Singapore anymore.

Electrical Safety Tips



Not sure how to safely operate the multiple household appliances in your employer's house? Bear in mind the following safety tips:

- Check that the plugs and electric wires of these appliances are in good condition before use.
- Switch off all household appliances and pull the plug out of the wall socket when not in use.
- Do not touch household appliances, switches, plugs and power points with wet hands.
- Do not try to repair household appliances by yourself.
- Do not overload electrical outlets by plugging in too many household appliances in one electrical socket.

Be alert of the Cash-on Delivery Scams during Great Singapore Sale



The cash-on delivery (COD) scam lures customers to pay in cash for parcels that

- They did not buy; or
- Did not match what they purchased

Victims often find themselves paying for junk items. By then, the delivery person has gotten away with the money.

To prevent it, you should never pay for items that you did not buy and reject payment of any suspicious parcel.
