





SINGAPORE WORKPLACE SAFETY & HEALTH REPORT


Number of fatal and major injuries in 1Q 2022 rose over the quarter, but fewer compared to same quarter last year. Number of minor injuries was lower compared to preceding quarters.



Construction, Manufacturing, and Transportation & Storage remained the top 3 sectors/industries with the most fatal and major injuries in 1Q 2022. Construction sector saw the biggest increase in major injuries compared to past quarters.



Slips, Trips & Falls remained the top cause of major injuries in 1Q 2022.

[3] Following the amendments to the Work Injury Compensation Act (WICA) which took effect from September 2020, employers need to report all work injuries with any instance of medical leave or light duties. From January 2021, injury numbers shared in WSH Report, 2021 will include injuries with at least one day of light duty or medical leave issued. Numbers presented under this new series will be marked with [N].
