FACTSHEET ON THE CET QUALIFICATION AWARD

An increasing number of workers are undertaking modular CET courses to meet immediate skills needs. While this is encouraging, workers stand to benefit even more if they go on to achieve a full qualification that will equip them with a more comprehensive skills set. This is especially beneficial to those who may have missed out on formal qualifications, those seeking a career change or those for which a formal qualification is beneficial to their career progression or job search.

2. A new CET Qualification Award (CQA) will be introduced to encourage Singaporean Citizen (SC) workers to attain a full skills qualification.

CET QUALIFICATION AWARD

- 3. Singaporeans who successfully attain a WSQ Diploma/Specialist Diploma or part-time Polytechnic Diploma for the first time after 1 March 2011 will be eligible for a CQA of \$1,000 in cash.
- 4. Singaporeans who successfully attain a WSQ Certificate/Higher Certificate/Advanced Certificate or part-time NITEC/Higher NITEC certificates for the first time after 1 March 2011 will be eligible for a CQA of \$200 in cash.
- 5. The difference in award values is due to differences in duration and cost of attaining the qualifications. Part-time Polytechnic Diploma and WSQ Diploma/Specialist Diploma programmes are typically of higher cost and longer duration than Certificate programmes.
- 6. In total, the Government has set aside about \$5.5 million per year to award first-time trainees who complete these qualifications.
