## FACTSHEET FOR WORKPLACE LITERACY PROGRAMMES

The Singapore Workforce Development Agency (WDA) is investing \$50 million into Workplace Literacy programmes over the next three years to help 60,000 lower income and lower skilled workers<sup>1</sup> improve their English proficiency so that they can access better job and training opportunities. This is part of the effort to raise the skills level of low wage workers, so as to achieve more inclusive growth.

- 2. The programme will be delivered through:
  - A new English @ Workplace Scheme; and
  - WDA's Continuing Education and Training (CET) centres

## **ENGLISH @ WORKPLACE SCHEME**

- 3. The English @ Workplace scheme encourages companies to provide English training at the workplace. This will make such training more accessible to workers and the courses more relevant to their work.
- 4. Under the scheme, companies will receive additional development grants to offset cost incurred in training, curriculum development and the adoption of other innovative design and delivery methods for Workplace English training. These development grants are over and above what the companies already enjoy in course fee funding and absentee payroll under WDA's existing programmes, including the Workfare Training Support (WTS) programme for low wage workers.
- 5. The English @ Workplace Scheme offers companies' two different options to better meet their needs when it comes to developing their in-house English training programme:
- Option A Companies can engage one of WDA's Workplace Literacy CET centres to design customised programmes and to conduct training at the companies' premises.
- Option B For companies that already have in-house training capability or are looking to establish their own in-house English training programmes, they can become an in-house provider and deliver their own English training.

## **WORKPLACE LITERACY PROGRAMMES AT WDA'S CET CENTRES**

- 6. WDA will also support "public walk-in" trainees, referrals from the Career Centres at the five Community Development Councils and at the Employment and Employability Institute (e2i). Employers who are unable to take part in the English @ Workplace Scheme but who wish to send their workers for Workplace literacy training may also do so through WDA's CET centres.
- 7. Since 2006, with improvements gradually made to the programme to increase its relevancy and cater to industry needs, WDA has filled about 38,000 literacy training places to date. The training received would provide trainees the ability to take on vocational training and opportunities to improve their career prospects.
- 8. The funding rates are similar to Option A under Table 2.
