WORKPLACE MAJOR INJURY RATE REACHES ALL-TIME LOW

Government steps up action on vehicular incidents

Annualised fatal injury rate rose

▶ **1.1** per 100,000 workers (1H 2026),
up from 0.97 (1H 2025)



Annualised major injury at all-time low

▶ **14.6** per 100,000 workers (1H 2026),
down from 15.8 (1H 2025), excluding
platform workers.



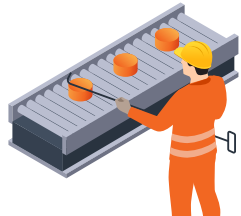

IMPROVED PLATFORM WORKER (PW) INJURY RATES

▶ The annualised PW fatal and major injury rate improved from **95.9** per 100,000 workers in 1H 2025 to **92.1** in 1H 2026

VEHICULAR INCIDENTS REMAIN A KEY AREA OF CONCERN

▶ However, vehicular incidents accounted for **38** of the **44** fatal and major injuries involving PWs in 1H 2026

MOM WILL CONTINUE TO TAKE FIRM ENFORCEMENT ACTION

against companies that fail to put in place adequate measures to protect their workers

MOM is reviewing measures such as bizSAFE to strengthen workplace safety and health ownership and accountability.
